In Summary we had 28 boats registered (29 in 2011), 23 started for Bermuda, 16 finished (six turned around for various reasons weather being a big part; Mirari's tortuous return home and the loss of Solid Air, Jan Steyn's new boat). 15 boats started in Bermuda for Newport (Flight Risk is on its way back now) and all 15 finished suffering the complete opposite of the 1st leg with lots of dead air especially for the slower boats.

We had 4 new skippers this year (Halcyon – Dan Alonso, Kiwi Spirit – Stanley Paris, Serif – Charles Schepens & Upstart – Bert Barrett our lone Canadian) (some of which you'll see have trophies) and more new crew.
