# **CHANGES FOR 2021**

The following changes are planned for 2021. - AIS transponder required (transmit and receive) The Geoffrey Spranger Team trophy requirements will be modified. Teams, two boats in different classes, will be randomly assigned. The result will be based on combined corrected time for both legs.
We have dropped off the Elapsed Time winners of each class. There have been complaints about how long the awards ceremony in Newport is and we felt that the Elapsed Time winners for each class is quite often a duplicate of the corrected time trophies. We also moved to trophies to the St. George's Prize Giving; Peter Hegeman Ancient Mariner's Trophy and Bermuda One-Two Longest Participation. These are applicable only to the Singlehanded leg and make more sense giving them out in Bermuda.
We are expecting to cut back a little on flares.

## COVID-19

Unless you have been on another world or just woke up from a coma of over a year Covid-19 restrictions are something we will have to deal with. Socializing will probably be restricted. I periodically monitor Bermuda and Rhode Island Covid-19 websites for impact to us. You might want to check out these websites. Right now, we are planning on making a go/no-go decision on 25 March. If we decide to go with the race, then the date when the fee goes up will slide from 1 April to 15 April. If we cancel the race, we will refund the fee. However, those refunds should also be with the understanding that a full refund my not be likely due to financial expenditures that have been made in anticipation that the usual mounting of the event would have been a GO (some expenses maybe absorbed by the committee if they can be used in the next race (like trophies).
