May 30: Deadline for arrival in Newport of first-time entrants & returnees with new boats

June 03: Newport to Bermuda Start

June 17: Bermuda to Newport Start

June 24: Awards in Newport

SKIPPERS AND BOATS

Ned Caswell had enough of his slow Columbia 34. He recently acquired a Helmsman 47, a narrow long boat. He plans on modifying the rig to make it more shorthanded friendly and expects to do the Bermuda 1-2 in 2005. Anyone want a Columbia 34?

Michael Millard sold his Quest 33, Wildeyes, and rumor has it that he is interested in an Open 40. Drew Wood is building several 6.5M boats. The first one was at the Newport Boat Show in September.

SOLO/TWIN

This year's Solo/Twin race was held 30/31 July. We had 51 boats this year, 10 were multihulls. This year we had only 1 solo monohull class, spinnaker with 7 boats, the rest were double-handed monohulls. Solo seems to be diminishing in the Solo/Twin.

OFFSHORE 160

We had 14 participants in this new version of what use to be 164 nm. Since the Coast Guard decided to take away our rounding mark, the only course I could come up with and still finish in a respectable time ended up being 177 nm. As Larry Pierce said, it was dizzying. The course ended up having quite a bit of windward work. Several people said they enjoyed it but it was obvious that it was very tough.

The quickest around the course was newcomer John Ryan on a Farr 40 (modified for shorthanded sailing). John is hoping to do the Bermuda 1-2 in 2005. Kristen Wenzel, who did the return trip in the 2003 Bermuda 1-2 on Aggressive, did this race on Aggressive and finished 2nd in her class. Rick McCally on Windswept slept the last leg "because it was all fog" and still won his class. Robert Johnston on Morning Dance couldn't get his spinnaker down at Nomans Land and decided to let it stream aft while going upwind until it got light outside and still won his class.
