2007 FALL SKIPPERS' SHORE PARTY

The next Skippers' Shore Party is scheduled for 3 November at the Newport Yacht Club. The Skippers' Shore Party starts at 1700 to start the gab session, and hors d'oeuvrs starts about 1730. 2007 BERMUDA ONE-TWO RACE RECAP

We had a record turn out this year with 40 boats starting to Bermuda on 9 June; almost 50% of the skippers were first timers. The enthusiasm was wonderful that these skippers brought to the event. I heard many statements of wanting to come back in 2009.

- We had our first tie in the singlehanded leg; new comer Rusty Duym on Williwaw and Peter McCrea on Panacea finished together for first place in Class 4 in Bermuda. Both, by the way, are from Maine.
- Also during the singlehanded leg, new skipper John VanSlyke on Bugaboo may have broken the record for the slowest trip down. He took 10 days to get to the finish line. John lost power from his batteries and unable to start the engine thus having no auto pilot requiring him to self steer, when he wasn't sleeping that is. We could tell when he slept; his track would go off in the wrong direction.
- Speaking about tracks, again we used Horizon Marine's iBoatTrack tracking which is a godsend for the race committee and helps make the Bermuda One-Two a spectator sport.
- Two new boats had to "bail" out within 24 hours of the start to Bermuda. Pegasus found a leak (he later found in the center board trunk) and decided to head back to fix it. Komera, an Open 6.5 mini, noticed a problem with his rigging and decided to return to avoid possible failure at sea.
- If you come from the planet mars, then you might not know that the Open 6.5 minis participated in the race as a class. We started them last but the fastest of them finished with the Class 1 boats; there wasn't a lot of windward work. We had 8 minis starting to Bermuda.
- There was a lot of reaching during the singlehanded leg and two boats actually lost their spinnakers and several were blown out. It was a fast ride down.
- Kip Stone's singlehanded course leg record which Kip established in 2005 on Artforms was broken by Joe Harris on Gryphon Solo. Joe did it in 66 hours 57 minutes.
- Doug Shearer's response to my telling him of the record was "it's hardly worth sailing if it's going to be that quick".
- Frog Kiss, Tristan Mouligne, had an amazing ride down and won his class as well as corrected overall first in the fleet. Then on the return leg, Frog Kiss lost his fore mast in the morning after the return start and headed back to St. George's to recoup. He rigged a staysail and was able to sail back quite a bit but not part of the return race.
- Kris Wenzel was the social director in Bermuda which was wonderful.
- Rusty Duym went from patient to patient carrying his tool bag. Rusty was kept busy fixing various things on many boats.
- Several boats went cruising while in Bermuda and said they had a great time. First time cruising, Dave Sherman, raved about it.
- The awards party in Bermuda was great. Mayor and past Commodore of St. George's Dinghy & Sports Club Mariea Caisey participated. Brian Oatley, Vice Commodore, was the master of ceremonies for the evening. Afterwards there was a steak fry and after that there was live music and dancing. A few pictures were taken while Patrick Mouligne danced up a storm.
- A number of boats had engine problems on the return: Convergence, Trpxprs, Wafi and Myrna Minkoff come to mind.

- First timer Peter Bourke on Rubicon finished last in Class 2 on the singlehanded leg however finished first both elapsed and corrected on the doublehanded leg.
- First timers were well represented in the medal. Don Gray managed second on both legs and combined in Class 2 on Warrior's Wish. Dan Stadtlander on Mirari finished 3rd on the singlehanded leg and 2nd in combined in Class 4. Michael "Ryan" Finn on Myrna Minkoff finished 1st in the Open 6.5s in both legs and combined. Jesse Naimark-Rowse on Reality finished 3rd in the Open 6.5s in both legs and combined. Linsay Lowe on Flying Tiger finished 3rd in the doublehanded leg.
- The return trip to Newport was marred by the presence of the Tall Ships; admittedly not good planning. Newport was crowded however the majority of folks made it to the Newport Awards Party.
- This is the first race that Juan Perez did not race and Doug Shearer ended up taking the senior skipper rank.

2007 NEW ENGLAND SOLO/TWIN

This year's Solo/Twin race was held 27/28 July. 39 boats entered this year. Again we had only 1 solo monohull class, spinnaker, this time with only 2 boats, there were 6 multis and the rest were double-handed monohulls. Solo seems to be diminishing in the Solo/Twin. We used the normal direction for the courses this year but due to the projected light wind only the fast monohulls and the multihulls did the 95 mile course. Any ways, 11 boats didn't finish.. Phil Garland and Lars Guck on Samba again finished first in Class 1, new comer David and son David Risch on Corsair finished first in Class 2, new comer Mark Winslow and Tim Brownell on Momentum finished first in Class 3, Ian Scott and John Corbishley on Coco finished first in Class 4 cruising, new comer Bill O'Hanley on Seaquel and potential future Bermuda One-Two skipper finished first in Class 5 solos and Don Watson and son Nat on Swamp Fox finished first in Class 6 multihulls. The boats generally made it to the western side of Block Island fairly quickly however between the wind dying and adverse current, many of the boats were parked trying to round the SW buoy. Pat and Alan Clayton get the record for the earliest boat to withdraw this year; they made it back to the club in time to have last call at the NYC bar (mud slides).
