# 2017 FALL SKIPPERS' PARTY

## 2019 BERMUDA ONE-TWO DATES

We have scheduled the next Bermuda One-Two in 2019. The start to Bermuda is on Saturday (yes it's not a Friday) 8 June and the return to Newport is on Thursday 20 June. Make your plans! At least we know that that I won't be having any conflicts with America's Cup there.

## SKIPPERS' REPRESENTATIVE

For those that may not know Tristan Mouligne continues his reign as the Skippers' Representative. Tristan has been participating in our Race Committee meetings in the preparations leading up to the 2017 Bermuda One-Two as well as racing in both the 2016 and 2017 New England Solo/Twin races as well as the 2017 Bermuda One -Two.

## 2017 BERMUDA ONE-TWO RECAP

Our numbers were up again (two races in a row) with four minis and two Class 40s. 38 skippers registered (14 were first timers which was nice to see), 34 boats started the singlehanded leg to Bermuda (2 additional boats, Inigo Montoya & Perseverance, shadowed the fleet to do the return doublehanded leg) and 28 boats finished. 3 of the boats that didn't finish motored (Carina, Strummer, Tyche) into Bermuda, one boat was abandoned (Spadefoot however the boat was recovered later) and two boats had to return to home due to damage (Flying Turtle had total electric failure due to an electrical storm and Scallywag II lost both autopilots). Stanley and Alan Paris met up with us in Bermuda for the return leg; they were unable to get their new boat ready in time for the singlehanded leg. 31 boats started the doublehanded leg to Newport (Strummer left for the Azores vice racing – however had to return to Bremuda, Team Wichard shipped his boat back to the states due to keel trunk damage and Spadefoot was still roaming around skipper less) and 29 finished (Tyche motored home and Pocket Rocket had to return to St. George's due to keel damage and also shipped his boat home).

- The start to Bermuda started with southerly winds at 10 kts and veered into the SW before the starts were finished. Michael Schum gave us some excitement when he lost his steering for a while, fixed it and carried on (just one of many Michael's stories for this race).

- Cordelia and Aggressive had an amazing race. They were near each other for most of the race. Cordelia pulled it out at the end.

- Team Wichard developed a crack in his keel box however was able to finish and win his class.

- The Gulf Stream was a nonevent however after that the boats had serious SW winds and square waves all the way to Bermuda; a very trying period. This storm increased and wreaked havoc with the OSTAR and TwoStar fleets racing to Newport; several boats were lost.

- Justin Wolfe on Spadefoot developed a keel problem, decided to abandon the boat and was picked up by Solarus.

- Corvus had head stay and engine problems. Nimros hung around Corvus until he got things going and they both finished. However both ended up having to be towed into St. George's; Nimros by Tyche who happened to be motoring by at the time. Aggressive was also towed into the harbor.

- John Andersen and Fred Green (return crew and land crew for Upstart) arrived before boats started arriving in Bermuda and were a big help in the Customs area with the boats.

- Kristen Wenzel also arrived early and took the first night duty which ended up being the busiest night. Thanks.

- Brenda Tweed (bartender/cook) and Kristen came up with an idea to do the Skipper's Arrival Party/Rum Swizzle night at the Dinghy Club instead of ferrying everyone out to the Swizzle Inn and it looked like we had outgrown the Swizzle Inn for the size of our group. We ordered too much Rum Swizzle so I was drinking it for the rest of my stay!

- On Saturday the 10<sup>th</sup> a group of us took the high-speed ferry from St. George's to the Dock Yard and watched the challenger finals of the America's Cup racing.

- At the awards in Bermuda the Mayor of St. George the Honorable Quinell Francis and Commodore Lacey Rance helped hand out the awards.

- Good thing Dan Alanso brought his dinghy out because both Dan and Tristan used it a lot for docking boats and ferrying people to their anchored boats. Thanks Dan.

- Patrick Paley again provided a bunch of pictures for us especially from the Awards.

- The return leg was much quieter although there were several issues; Pocket Rocket had to return to St. George's (the keel fix wasn't the right fix), Halcyon's back stay loosened up some more (they jury rigged it to tighten it up) and Concussion developed a crack in their mast below the partners. They effectively put a brace around it and were able to finish the race although they were shadowed by the Coast Guard starting somewhere out past Martha's Vineyard.

This leg saw an amazing race between the first three boats of Class 1; two Class 40s Dragon and Toothface 2 and Inigo Montoya with Dragon first to finish followed by Toothface 2 12 minutes later and Inigo Montoya 9 minutes after that.
This race had, I believe, two people that were the oldest to date to do the race: Rod Johnstone crew at 80 and Stanley Paris skipper at 79. Also, there was a total of 9 skipper/crew over 70 and 32 skipper/crew 60 and over. Think this is an older person race? To counter that we had 7 skipper/crew under 40.

Fred Cosandey says he will not make the next race. He is having a bigger boat made and will be sailing it abroad. However, his crew, Ernest Berger, has already said he will fly down in 2019 to help with the boats coming into Bermuda for the singlehanded leg.

#### 2017 NEW ENGLAND SOLO/TWIN

This year's Solo/Twin race was held 28/29 July. 27 boats entered this year (down from 33 last year). We had one solo monohull spinnaker class with 4 participants, one multihull class with 4 participants and the rest were doublehanded monohulls. The predictions for the weather were very light winds for Friday into Saturday and a Northeaster with significant NE breeze starting late Saturday morning. We developed two new courses, 60 and 70 nm in length to try to get the boats in before the Northeaster got bad. The fast spinnaker class and multi-hulls were given the 70 nm course and the rest did the 60 nm course. Since the first boat to finish was 0116 Saturday morning and the last one was 0712 the courses worked well and all were done before the significant winds came in. The boats started in pretty light winds out of the SE; 3 boats weren't paying attention and were very late to their start. The first boat to finish as well as first corrected was veteran Bermuda One-Two Tristan Mouligne with Ted Winston on Samba at 01:16 am Saturday sailing in Class 1 on the 70 nm course. Talisman sailed by Richard Pedone and Christopher Mooradian finished 1<sup>st</sup> elapsed and corrected time in Class 2. The first boat to finish in Class 4 was Bella sailed by first time entrants Tony Giarratana and John David Faulders however on corrected time Larvik a Pearson 10M sailed by Kim Andersen and William Beebe were first. Paul Cronin on Kincora finished first in Class 5, the Solo monohull spinnaker class, both on elapsed and corrected times. Back after several years missing from the race was Class 6 elapsed and corrected time winner Swamp Fox sailed by Don and Nat Watson. Three boats withdrew this year.

Ten boats had family crew.
